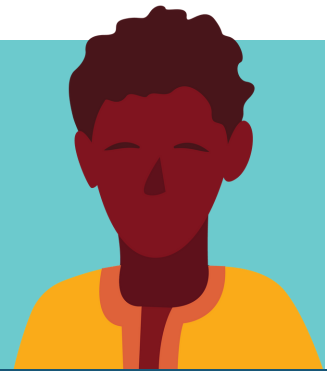

FAST FACTS

Global Youth Culture is a research study that covers the beliefs and behaviors of more than 8,300 digitally connected teenagers from 20 diverse nations.

Data was collected in 2020 between the end of February and the end of March - before the effects of the global pandemic were felt in a widespread way.

TEENS ARE SORTING THROUGH WHAT THEY BELIEVE



Over half (52%) of teens globally say they never read religious scripture on their own.



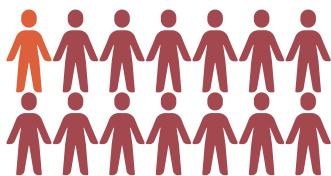
While 43% of teens surveyed self-identified as Christian,

just 7% displayed the beliefs and characteristics of a committed Christian.

TEENS AROUND THE WORLD ARE STRUGGLING WITH MANY DIFFERENT TYPES OF PERSONAL STRUGGLES



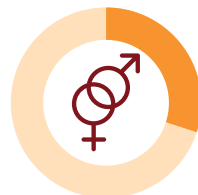
1 in 4 of teens globally report having had suicidal thoughts within the last three months.



1 in 14 have actually attempted to take their own life.



Girls are hit harder than boys when it comes to their mental health and are almost twice as likely to say they have made a suicide attempt.



3 in 10 teens globally report having been sexually active in the past three months. The rate is even higher among Christians (1 in 3).



1 in 5 teens globally report being sexually attracted to someone of the same gender within the past three months.
